CRAFT MADE BY PEOPLE

Tajikistan is famous for its dynasties of craftsmen who pass their ancient arts from generation to generation. Handicraft products are often manufactured by rural women whose skilful hands have been making fabrics, accessories and jewellery for many centuries.

Ozara is a social enterprise promoting traditional Tajik handicraft products. By using authentic design elements and combining them with modern colours, Ozara supports the preservation of classical ornaments and production skills, translating them into a contemporary and fashionable context.











DUE TO TRADITION

Tajik embroidery is famous far beyond the borders of the country. Its popularity is explained by historical traditions and rites. Embroidery goods are usually made for the wedding in the bride's house and are a part of the dowry. The embroidery reflects the people's perception of the universe and nature in the plant and animal ornaments used.

NATURAL BEAUTY

Often placed at the heart of a motive, concentric elements indicate that the sun is the centre of our universe whereas floral motives such as the tulip and the lily enrich the ornaments. The opulently coloured pomegranate is a motive also frequently used. The fruit originally derives from Persia and stands for fertility. Pomegranate extract is also used as a natural dye for threads.

Ikat is a weaving technique used to pattern textiles. The fabric is made with yarn which is dyed in sections before the weaving process. Our Ikat fabrics are handwoven on traditional looms and sewn into pillows by women from the Sughd region in Tajikistan.

MAGICAL **POWER**

Tajik jewellery reflects the social norms, religious beliefs, social relations and traditions.

Our silver jewellery is fully hand-made and carefully processed by casting, engraving, chasing and carving. Semi-precious stones like coral, carnelian and turquoise are carefully embedded: they are said to have the magical power of talismans.







Carnelian is believed to bring peace and prosperity, abundance and joy. Corals promise wealth and many children.

Turquoise can ensure victory even in the most hopeless battle, and Pearl has the ability to heal sicknesses and protects from misfortune and sorrow.

MAKE YOUR **DAY**

Carved wood plays an important role in Tajik daily life. It decorates houses, household objects, utensils, doors, frames, souvenirs and much more.

Wood carving is one of the most ancient and widespread crafts in Tajikistan. The carvings show traditional floral and geometrical patterns.

Suzani pillow cover

Dimensions: 20" x 20" (50 x 50 cm), 16" x 16" (40 x 40 cm), 12" x 20" (30 x 50 cm)

- Made of pure cotton
- Hand-embroidered with cotton thread
- Reverses to unicoloured (solid back)

Ikat pillow cover

Dimensions: 20" x 20" (50 x 50 cm)

- Hand-dyed and hand-woven on a traditional loom
- Fabric made of pure cotton
- Reverses to the same design
